





A Word from the Chairperson

We decided to call this concert "Change the World," and as I contemplate what that means to me, I am feeling the weight of that sentiment. It seems like such an enormous job. I tend to shut down when I feel overwhelmed by or underprepared for a task, which is no help if I'm trying to change the world.

Therefore, I have to reframe my thinking about it so that I'm not paralyzed by the scale of the change that needs to occur. I'm not changing the world... I'm just doing a thing. It might be a small thing, like introducing a friend to someone who I think they may be compatible with. (I'm a pretty good matchmaker, it turns out.) It might be voting. It might be driving someone to a doctor's appointment. It might be coming out at my job. But these are small acts that can ripple forward in time to produce change.

All of us are making these kinds of changes to the world on a daily basis, performing small acts of kindness or courage that may serve as inspiration to someone else. Often we aren't even aware that we have done it ... maybe you smiled at someone at a moment when they had just about given up on the idea of kindness in the world. Sometimes, change is more obvious... like if you work for a political campaign to help get someone elected whose policies are more humane than the other candidates.

I know that at this moment, I'm exceedingly grateful that a group of queer Syracuse residents decided to start up a chorus in 1991. That act certainly changed my world, and all of us in this room today are here because of them!

As we head into the last few days of Pride Month, take a moment to reflect upon all the individuals whose presence positively altered the world that we live in now: the drag queens at Stonewall; the ACT UP protesters; the first people to come out in the workplace; the first openly gay politicians; the founding members of SGLC; and all the individuals whose legacy is harder to point to -- we are in their debt.



And now it's our job to keep the change flowing. Be kind to each other and to yourselves. Go out there and change the world.

Our History

In the spring of 1991, following a performance by the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus in Syracuse, a sign-up sheet was put out for people interested in forming a similar chorus in Syracuse. Originally the idea was that this was to be a men's chorus, but thankfully, several courageous women added their names to the list. Planning meetings were held, and finally, a mixed chorus was formed.

In the late summer of 1991, the chorus met for their first rehearsal, led by director Carl Johengin. Over thirty like-minded people attended the first rehearsal. Preparation for our first concert took several months, culminating with two sold-out performances of our Holiday Concert in December 1991. The chorus has been performing regularly ever since, except for a break during covid. We remain one of the oldest active mixed choruses in the country, if not the world. We also have performed and continue to perform in a number of road appearances throughout New York State.

Interested in Joining Us? Singing Members

We are a non-auditioned chorus and heartily welcome new singing members to join us. Anyone is welcome to join during the first three weeks of our concert rehearsal season. At that time, our Choral Director will guide you to one of the SATB sections that is most comfortable for your vocal range.

To purchase music and cover expenses, chorus members pay dues for the concert season. Scholarships are available for those with limited resources.
